

PONDERINGS DEP'T



MMM WEB SITE HACKED AND DESTROYED !!!!

Colorado has been hit with some disasters this year. If you even have television you would know that there have been many fires in the state. Fortunately, they haven't impacted the club activities, but it they did affect a few of the members.

Jerry Murphy and Darold Jones were both evacuated from their homes in Manitou Springs from the Waldo Canyn fire and Dave Wineland and Cass Pangell were on a pre-evacuation alert from the fire in Boulder.

But the biggest disaster affecting the club was the total hacking and destruction of our web site. I was out of town for about 2 weeks in early June and when I got back there was this note that the MMM web site was acting up. I logged into it and all sorts of nasty note appeared.

I immediately called my son, who is our gracious web hoster and he said he would look into it right away.

We had been hacked into before but that was from what they call a "bot" hacker, which is like an auto program that searches for loopholes in emails or any other thing 24/7. Many of us have had this type of hacking on our email systems. For those episodes, changing passwords solves the problem.

But, this intrusion was BIG time. It was hacked by a group that spends ALL of their free time scanning the web looking for thins to hack and destroy. They are internationally known and for whatever reason, found a lead into our site. The original entry came from this outfit and was in Greece. We had done this several years ago, and it was a success. I had over twenty participants in the building phase. The Delta Darts, although airworthy, did not stand up to the rigors of preteens, dogs and sibling rivalry. I saved the catapult gliders for the contest and they flew great!
