


<u>Motorcycle Use on the Field</u> <u>Policy:</u>

"The Fun Meter" Happy New Year!

2019 promises to be a fantastic year, with new contests, new types of contests and lots of "Scrambling" in between. First, a shout-out to Jack Murphy and Al Meacham, who are CD-ing the MMM Club's first out of state contest -- the Casino Cup--at Wendover, NV, 15-16 June. Mark the date and check the flyer. Looks like it will be well worth the trip! Next, a plug for the AMA Indoor Nationals, which will be held from 30 May to 2 June in the superb Round Valley Dome in Eagar/Springerville, AZ. Our own Don DeLoach and PMAC's Tom Gaylor are sharing Contest Manager/Contest Director duties, with lots of support from our respective clubs. Early indications are that the second western Indoor Nats in recent years (following the Jerry Murphy/Rob Romash-led success here in 2015) will be very well attended. If you haven't visited the Dome, head south and treat yourself to a 100-foot ceiling. It's a thrill.

Closer to home, MMM's annual major indoor contest, the Pikes Peak Ceiling Climb takes place on the 13th of January at the City Aud in Colorado Springs. Come on down, and even if you're not flying, bring your stopwatch and help out. Better yet--dust off your old No-Cals, Peanuts, Pennyplanes or P-18s and fly.

Something I'm very excited about is the Indoor Scramble. The idea has been kicking around for a few years, but it looks as if we're finally on the verge of bringing it together, thanks to the work of our indoor brain trust led by Tom Norell, the club's Indoor Coordinator. Details aren't quite ready for publication yet, but the basic idea will be to permit planes of different classes to compete against each other by scoring flights as a fraction of existing records. Some great conversations are happening around this and just as soon as the details are finalized they'll be shared. Watch the newsletter and the Yahoo Group. We hope to begin this season following the Ceiling Climb. A little administrative stuff: Per our by-laws, the club operates using an executive council whose purpose is to advise the president closely and to take advantage of the club's collective experience. This year the EC will consist of those holding an elected office (Don DeLoach-VP, Chuck Etherington-Secretary/Treasurer, and I), plus our two most recent past presidents, Pete McQuade and Jerry Murphy. Thank you, guys! It's a comfort to a rookie President to have the counsel of such an accomplished bunch, along with that of Rick Pangell, who puts in countless hours managing the club's newsletter, website, critical documents, and what's got to be one of the most complete contact lists of free flighters anywhere.

I'd like to wrap up by sharing two themes Pete McQuade raised at the annual meeting with which I agree 100%. The first has to do with the seriousness with which we approach our hobby. Sometimes we're too serious! Please, please do your best to maintain perspective. I forget the precise context, but Pete's comment was, "for cryin' out loud--these are model airplanes." Amen. Nothing we do here compares in importance to any of the more serious events in our lives. Need a list? Start with health issues of ourselves and our loved ones. Please be healthy this year, and I most definitely include mental health and even hobby burnout as a concern. Keep a close eye on that fun meter, and if the needle's not way to the right, we're doing something wrong.

The other of Pete's themes--very much related-- was that we're all friends here. I think that understates it considerably! We're lifelong friends with decades of shared experiences, with ties to each other like I've seen in no other organization. If ever you doubt just how special this club is, stick around after a contest some summer afternoon, when the chairs are drawn into a circle as the sun sets. Sooner or later Darold tells a joke and before you know it there are stories kicking around about planes, people, chases, rules, flying sites, larger-than-life thermals, cows(?)-you name it. This club is rich beyond belief with lore, talent and experience, much of it having to do with model airplanes! I actually don't care if my planes don't fly all that well. Just getting to share the sky with this group is a privilege.

The meeting was held at the Colorado Springs Fire Station 19 from noon to 4:00 and presided over by Pete McQuade. Twelve MMM members were in attendance.

Presentation by Crosswinds RC Club

 Fellow Lowry Ranch lessee, Crosswinds RC, paid us a reciprocal visit and made some presentations: Doug Gilbert (President) spoke about the club and flying facility, Ray Nyce (w/ wife Dianne Bailey) discussed his electric control line contest experience, and Dennis Thomas (w/ wife Dorethea) gave an informative presentation about the Tuskegee Airmen. Jim Walker (Member at Large) was assisting as well. During Dennis' talk, Keith Davis from the Pikes Peak RC Club presented Dennis with two G.I. Joe Tuskegee Airmen figures. Very nice gesture.

Review of 2018

- Chuck Etherington gave a financial report referencing the document entitled "Statement of Finances."

Following a good discussion about points availability for Scrambles with fewer than three entries, a vote was taken. The formula that received the most votes called for 75 points to be awarded to the winner of scrambles in which there are only two entries and 50 points for a single entry.

Safety Issues

- Very brief refresher on the operation of the club defibrillator
- Emergency Rooms: Southlands has been determined to be the closest adequate ER facility and we will modify our directions and maps to reflect that.
- Rattlesnakes: Chuck and Don demonstrated how to use the snake handling tools (stored in the clubhouse) to move rattlers to a safer place. Rattlers are very rare but if encountered, Don or Chuck will move them. If someone is bit by a rattler, do not attempt to treat. Just get them to the Southlands ER ASAP by the most expeditious means (vehicle or 911 medical response). To be prepared, Southlands ER should be advised as early as possible. Their phone number will be in our 1st aid kit.
- Pete discussed the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2018 and how it affects us.

A Look Ahead to 2019

Why I Build and Fly Model Airplanes by Karl Gies

What endures in this hobby of building model airplanes are the feelings about your work and creations. You would not trade your models for anybody's, not even the best models ever made because they were made by someone else.

I remember the late Joe Macay entering an old time rubber stick model with a one bladed folder in the concours d'-elegance at Muskogee. He showed it to me and as I looked at it he read my thoughts.

Joe was not a pretty builder but a person I will never forget. Joe let it all hang out and was a totally honest person. Joe said to me "I know that it will not win but to me it is the most beautiful model in the world because I gave it my all and I am entering it for myself."

Later on he flew it for me. It was a great performer and a Jonathan Livingston Seagull moment for both of us. As we struggled to get it out of a downwind tree Joe said "Isn't this just great."

Being a builder of intermediate skills in all respects I can stare at a model that I have built over and over. This would never happen with a model that I did not build. I will admire another's model analytically trying to learn from it and be motivated by the craftsmanship. But it will never be mine at rest or in the air and my spirit will never soar with it.



NFFS 2019 CALL FOR PAPERS

Model aircraft have evolved for centuries and it is not just a USA thing. First there were basic gliders, then elastic bands, ignition motors, glow engines, new construction methods, new adhesive and finishing materials, you name it. With each technological advance we Free-Flighters have embraced new technologies, leading us to changes we only imagined, and in many cases didn't expect! Many factors influence the evolution of our aircraft and the way we operate them, though--not simply technological ones.

We now have over 50 years of NFFS Symposia under our belt and during this time we've seen and documented much of the changing Free Flight landscape. As we kick off another year, the persistent question remains...*not what is the future of Free Flight, but what will Free Flight look like in the future*? So--with one view to the past and the other looking forward, we'd like to offer a theme for the 2019 Symposium:

Evolution in Free Flight - The Need of Invention

While we'd <u>much</u> prefer to hear your thoughts on this theme, we offer a few teasers or ideas for you to ponder, in no particular order:

- Articles we are looking for want to have a premise, not just a presentation. Why is your article/model created? Where will your technology take model aircraft? Need spurns invention. How have we ridden that fine line between max performance and practicality?
- Evolution of any particular aspect of free flight aircraft airfoils, aerodynamics, engines, propulsion, timing & control devices, composite materials, e.g. why did the introduction of carbon fiber influence your designs--or electric motors and systems.
- Rules, technical implications of rule changes at any level... FAI, AMA, Indoor:
 - Our most stable rules--what are they and why have they remained successful? What are the fundamental attributes of a great competition rule?
 - What rule changes might we be on the verge of making? What pressures are there on our present rules--which may really be, **what has become of our airplanes and events and** what will become of our airplanes as rule changes are implemented?
- Entry & Exit of Free Flighters into and out of the hobby. Where do they come from? Where do they go? What attracts them? What dismays them? What converts spectators into passionate participants? Your successes and failures pursuant to getting new flyers? (*suggests data survey*?)

Put your imagination to work and submit a topic you wish to pursue for inclusion in the 2019 NFFS Symposium.

If similar topics are received, we will make an effort to put those authors together for a collaborative article. If you've been kicking around an idea for an article that doesn't quite match this theme (for instance, a purely technical article on construction or aerodynamics), submit it anyway! Maybe with the addition of a little context, it could very possibly find a home in the 2019 National Free Flight Symposium.

Submit a synopsis of your proposed article with title and/or idea, preferably with an outline of your topic and what your article will be about as soon as possible to:


