


If there was a better opportunity to stay at home and build models, this was it!

Pete McQuade and John McGrath CDs, MMM 14-Round Contest



Contest Report MMM Coronavirus-Era Postal Contest May 9-24, 2020 Pete McQuade, CD

With Colorado's coronavirus stay-at-home order having nixed our April Scramble, the MMM Leadership Council voted to get back to flying as soon as safely possible. Governor Polis's "safer-at-home" Executive Order still frowned upon travel outside one's own county, so we decided to try a "postal" contest, instead of a regular Scramble at Lowry. This was to allow people to fly at any suitable field within their home county. Since this meant some would be flying on very small fields, we adjusted our usual Scramble rules as follows:

- 1. Maxes were reduced. So, normal 3-minute events would have 2-minute maxes. And normal 2-minute maxes were reduced to 90 seconds.
- 2. We set a limit of 10 straight maxes. As it turned out, we darned near had to invoke this rule!
- 3. E-36 and AMA Gas events would have 5-second motor runs.
- 4. A flier would have to make all his flights on a single day. The contest window was from Saturday, May 9 to Sunday, May 24.
- 5. This contest would not count for MMM Season-Scramble points. It was just an opportunity to get out and fly! It was not an AMA-sanctioned event.

The May Postal Contest winner was Stan Buddenbohm, who flew at Perris, CA and logged 9 maxes in E-36. And he actually flew 9 two-minute maxes, even though our rules had reduced the max to 90 seconds! Close behind him, Tim Batiuk—also flying at Perris—racked up 7 maxes in hand-launch glider. Closer to home, John McGrath went to a local park and flew a small rubber model to a very respectable three-flight total of 238 seconds. Rick Pangell took his CLG to Cornerstone Park in Littleton, CO, early in the morning and recorded an admirable three-flight total of 185 sec. Finally, Ray Boyd flew a cabin rubber model to 119 seconds in two flights.

Congratulations to you hearty fliers. You proved that the pandemic couldn't stop free flight! If I've missed anyone's scores, I apologize! Please let me know and I'll publish an update to this report.

MMM Coronavirus-Era Postal Contest... more...

MAY (NOT AN ACTUAL MMM SCRAMBLE) SCRAMBLE

Report by Stan Buddenbohm...

Left remote Boulevard California about 3:30 am to arrive at the Perris field about 6 am... no one else there. The entry off the highway is more eroded and you have to be careful. The dirt road in has been damaged by semi-trucks and rain, but passable. Rumor had it that the launch area would be cleared of weeds the day before – and it was! Just stubble over that area and the 200 ft wide drainage canal was dry.

I got the first flight in about 6:30 am, no testing, great pattern and flight. Only drifted about 1/5th of a mile but it was across the canal so more of a chase than I had wanted.

The next flight I went upwind more. Still did not land on the cleared launch area but it was only a couple of rows of mounds in. These mounds, a thousand of them, were dumped by an endless procession of trucks beginning at least a year ago. Compost, average about 4 ft high with 2 ft high dips between them. Now they have weathered a bit and there are many weeds growing among and between them. Hard to chase and find your model. The third flight had a weak battery but still dt'd 30 ft up. The next three were all uneventful. Then I switched to flying HLG with Tim Batiuk.

Tim was way ahead in HLG and flying his "InfernoTLG" beautifully. Drift was not much and 90 sec flights might not get out of the launch area much. I made 4 maxes before hitting down air for 53 seconds. Tim made at least 7 maxes.

Back to E36, but getting a bit breezy. I made 3 more with some interesting flights. My last, On the 10th, I had a perfect climb and transition, very high. A lock., right? NOPE, God sat on it for just 63 seconds.

A great day, thanks for giving us the inspiration for doing this!

Back in the eighties Tibor Gall joined PPSS. Tibor was a former Hungarian Freedom Fighter and was formally educated as a young person in aerodynamics. He also loved to fly sailplanes but what he really liked was free flight and he frequently flew both at our old field near T-Gap and Powers Blvd, then a two lane blacktop in the country.

Tibor called me to fly very often which didn't endear him to my wife who felt I should be working on our old Victorian house instead of being down in the basement building sailplanes. I recall one of my kids called down to say "Dad, that guy is on the phone again!". From that moment on Tibor always called me "Daddy".

So Tibor flew with the club typically with a two meter sailplane and became sort of the clubs singular character. When he died from cancer we began a two meter series called the "Tibor Cup" which was quite popular. As time went by I drifted into free flight with my son Todd and his boys who it turned out didn't inherit the modeling gene. For many years Todd and I kept flying competitively with MMM in Denver at the former Lowry Bombing Range that is 27, 000 acres of prairie with hills, rocks and all too often winds that cause Easy-Ups to thermal out.

On this one occasion, Todd was flying a small electric model called the "E-36" that only had a 36" wingspan. However is spite of their very small size they are very fine performers and can fly many consecutive Max flights. Being late in the afternoon the wind was up and the models drifted far away, often as far as a mile causing retrieval difficulties. Free flights often use an electronic tracker developed for Falconry in order to locate them in the hilly prairie wilderness. As it happened, Todd hadn't installed the device in his model and the little E-36 was lost in spite of searching for hours.

Several months went by and Todd received a call asking "Are you Todd Reynolds?" It turned out that a construction worker found the wing from the E36 that had Todd's name and phone number on it just south of the MMM field. Todd explained that it was from a Free flight that he had been flying that had been lost. The fuselage wasn't found and is likely still moldering away under some brush somewhere.

The fellow who found the wing in conversation mentioned that his Dad used to fly free flight long ago. Todd asked "Really?, what was his name??" Came the answer "His name was Tibor Gall"

I suppose you could say that Tibor is watching over modelers especially free flighters who need more help than most. Thanks Tibor!

Qualification for USA Team Finals

In response to the uncertain future of the contest schedule, the Team Selection Committee has decided to waive qualification requirements for the 2020 Finals. There will be no requirement to accumulate time or World Cup contest participation. You will still need to pay the Program Entry Fee (\$90) and the Finals Entry Fee (\$250), but you may proceed directly to the Finals without further efforts. The reduced fee structure for lower age and for returning and first time entrants will remain the same. The deadlines for entries to be in AMA's hands will remain the same.

A decision on the Finals is still premature. We are watching the lead of the local agencies and of sporting leagues, theater groups, etc. to see not only if they begin to function but if so, how. We expect to make a final determination by mid August. By then we should have a pretty good idea of how re-opening the country is progressing. For what it is worth in the last hour, the Director of the Los Angeles County Health Department specifically noted in her daily TV address that model airplane venues were permitted to open provided proper protocol such as distancing, limited contact, etc are followed. There are certainly many issues for us to resolve such as the availability of lodging, restaurants, etc. LA County is about 15% higher than the state and national average for illness, so if they are comfortable letting us do our thing, I suspect other Counties will follow. The numbers for Kern County appear to be right at the state average.

There is not much more we can do right now except wait, but I will keep you informed as this progress.

Come fly with us at the largest and most beautiful flying site in North America. Within the 14-R are the Centennial and Columbine Cups, separate 7-round FAI competitions. Traditional MMM perpetual silver trophies for F1A-B-C and perpetual silver cups for F1G-H-J-S will be awarded based on combined performance over the regular rounds in both competitions. (Ties will be broken with flyoffs.) Only eight MMM Master Sportsmen have earned Blue Jackets, since 1980. Earn one by flying a perfect fourteen 180-second maxes over the two days in F1A-B-C-P-Q, or Legacy F1A-B-C.

Legacy FAI events. Bring out your old FAI models! (Placings and awards separate from "modern" FAI events.) Flown as Legacy ABC Combo, F1A(L)-B(L)-C(L). And Legacy GHJ Combo, F1G(L), F1H(L), F1J(L).

The event rules:

F1A(L): Current FAI rules except no bunt allowed.

F1B(L): 40g motor/190g min, no DPR or VIW; OR 35g motor/ 200g min, no DPR OR

50g max motor, 8 oz. min. gross weight, and vintage 1957-1964 Wakefield design.

F1C(L): NFFS Vintage FAI rules. (see < https://freeflight.org>).

F1G(L): No DPR, no auto-surfaces.

F1H(L): Current F1H rules except no bunt; OR 5.08 oz min., no circle tow, no bunt.

F1J(L): 7-sec engine run, no bunt.

AMA/NFFS/SAM events: 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

No rounds. In combined events, fly any/all events you wish; we will use your best single event score for awards purposes. HLG/CLG will use launch pen.

Saturday, July 11: CLG, P-30, Fast Gas Combo*, OT Rubber Combo, E-36, E-Nos, Combo


