
Add that to all of the visitors who want to come to Colorado because they have been cooped up for a year and it takes up quite a bit of time!

2021 Casino Cup Wrap

The Third Annual 2021 Cup was held over Father's Day Weekend June 19-20 near West Wendover NV. The host MMM Club was well represented with Darold Jones, John McGrath and Jerry Murphy making the trip as well as CDs Jack Murphy and Allan Mecham. There were 14 competitors overall, a turnout that was hampered somewhat by the 100 degree heat forecast that kept some at home. Mike Fedor hailed all the way from Texas, and there were sportsmen from CA, AZ & UT as well.

There were 5 entrants in F1A, a respectable turn out that resulted in a fly off between Enes Pecenkovic and Mike McKeever. Enes prevailed by 75 seconds in the Sunday morning relatively calm air. Ben Tarcher prevailed by 10 seconds over Jack Murphy in F1Q.

Electric classes proved to be popular culminating in the "Big Daddy" on Sunday. The special event is named in honor of the late, great John Oldenkamp, combining E36 and F1S flights as well having a P-30 feature. The Electric portion was won by George Morris, with Janna VanNest dominating the Women's Division.

<u>Contest Report: 42nd Annual MMM 14-Round Contest</u> <u>Denver, July 9-11, 2020</u>

This year's 14-Rounder and F1E World Cup Contest were held in weather that free flighters dream about. With a few exceptions, winds were generally light all three days. The summer temperatures were tolerable on Friday and downright pleasant on Saturday and Sunday. We had some haze from forest fires in the western states, and this made timekeeping a bit challenging at times. But overall, the weather was our friend. We greatly appreciated all who attended, both those from the local area and those from out of state. Among those who traveled to the contest were two first-timers to the 14-Rounder: Bob Galler of Albuquerque and Grady Turner of Texas. We hope to see you fine gentlemen on the field again soon!

The F1E World Cup contest was held Friday on our hill at Indian Point. Jace Pivonka was the CD for this contest. After meeting at the gate slightly after 9a.m., the five flyers, support crew, and chase crew consolidated all their gear into fewer vehicles and headed up to the Southwest corner of the F1E hill. The hill is located directly north of the main MMM field on the north side of Quincy. It was decided that the first round would begin at 10:30 to allow sufficient time for flyers to prepare their models. The flight line was initially placed on the north side of the hill, running west to east. Conditions in the morning were very favorable for F1E as the wind was light but sustained and the temperature was pleasant. The max time throughout the contest was set at 180 seconds due to the chase difficulty surrounding the flying area.

The first round of F1E began very well, with all of the flyers launching in quick succession and all but one flyer making the max. The rounds became increasingly difficult throughout the day as the wind speed and temperature increased. In the second and third rounds, only three flyers made the max. With the approval of all flyers, we shortened the rounds. The wind began to swing around to the east during the 4th round, leading to a line switch before the 5th. At this point, Mike Richardson, Bob Sifleet, and Tom Ioerger were in a very tight race, with only 15 points separating first and third place. After about an hour of waiting, the wind had rotated far enough that it was coming out of the southeast, and the line was moved to the opposite side of the hill from the first four rounds. With slightly less gradient, the south face of the hill made for another difficult round, to close out the contest. In fact, the 4th and 5th rounds saw only one flyer max in each round. Bob held on to claim the title, with Tom in second place, and Mike in third. Peter Brocks and Rick Pangell rounded out the field of hearty fliers. Despite the challenging conditions, the winning percentage was 472.78 points out of a possible 500. Second and third places were close behind. A full slate of FAI, AMA, NFFS, and SAM events were flown both Saturday and Sunday. The FAI portion included two separate contests, Saturday's Centennial Cup and Sunday's Columbine Cup. Each of these contests featured seven rounds of F1A, B, and Q (we had no F1C/P entries), as well as eight rounds of the mini-FAI events, F1G, H, J, and S. Special perpetual trophies were awarded to the top performers in each of these events over the entire two days.

A highlight of the weekend was Grill Master Frank Menanno's fabulous food at lunchtimes. Hamburgers, hot dogs, and brats were the main course on Saturday. Frank even had a vegetarianburger option. Sunday featured excellent barbecued chicken. Yumm....

Another high point of the weekend was Saturday's on-the-field ceremony to honor the inauguration of the **MMM Hall of Fame**, and the induction of the first six Hall-of-Famers. MMM President John McGrath led the ceremony, which included unveiling a large permanent plaque that includes the

engraved names of "the Class of 2021," and has plenty of room for future inductees. Then the names of the inductees were read aloud, along with a summary of each person's outstanding contributions to the MMM and to Free Flight in general. The inductees included three legendary MMM'ers who are no longer with us: Bill Etherington, Bill Gibbons, and Bill Gieskieng. The other three inductees were Jerry Murphy, Rick Pangell, and Ken Phair. Fortunately, all three were present to receive their individual plaques and certificates. By a fortunate coincidence, Ken's daughter Michelle was also present to see her dad honored.

Of course, the real focus of the 14-Rounder was on the flying. In the <u>"large" FAI events</u>, Enes Pecenkovic of California had his LDA Nordics skyrocketing into the sky to win F1A both days and also the 14-Round F1A championship.

In F1B, Wakefield rubber, Blake Jensen won Saturday's Centennial Cup event, with Jace Pivonka in hot pursuit. The next day, Jace maxed out and Blake missed the perfect score by a heartrending 1 second. But Blake's Saturday score gave him enough margin to capture the 14-Round championship. But the drama didn't end there. On Jace's final flight on Sunday, his mechanical timer failed and the model flew away to the south. Undaunted, Jace set off on his motorcycle, accompanied by Don DeLoach. Meanwhile, the timekeepers, led by Chuck Etherington, staunchly remained at their posts, maintaining contact with the chasers. Over an hour later, aided by a strong signal on the trusty Walston tracker, Jace and Don found the wayward model nestled in a grassy field in a neighborhood of ranchette acreages. It had been a flight of 6.5 miles in the gentle lateafternoon/early evening breeze. Loud was the applause that greeted Jace and Don upon their return, which was aided by Chuck, who had driven out in his car to carry the model back, so that Jace could concentrate on the long motorcycle ride.

On Saturday in F1Q Electric, the fliers made a gentlemen's agreement to cease flying after five rounds, because the winds were increasing. At that point, Bob Sifleet was clean with five maxes, to take the Centennial Cup. The next day, Bob continued his winning ways by recording seven more maxes. Although this guaranteed Bob the 14-Round title, it put him in a tie with Tom Ioerger for Sunday's Columbine Cup, since Tom also maxed out that day. The two fliers agreed to hold the flyoff at a later date, in another location.

In the mini-FAI events, both Tiffaney O'Dell and Don DeLoach maxed out Saturday in F1G, Coupe d'Hiver rubber. In the flyoff for the Centennial Cup, Tiffaney handily made the 3-minute max, aided by a superb climb under power. But Don's model was lost to sight as it glided behind a ridge, just 2 frustrating seconds short of the max. The following day, Tiffaney continued to max, and won both the Columbine Cup and the overall 8-Round championship, with a perfect score of 960! John McGrath wasn't far behind, for second place in the 8-Round event, and Don was third. Blake Jensen had F1H towline glider all to himself, but that didn't deter him from racking up an outstanding performance with his high-bunting model. He made 7 maxes out of 8 flights over the two days. Thus, he took all three titles: Centennial Cup, Columbine Cup, and the 8-Round Championship.

We had no F1J fliers on Saturday, but Rick Pangell and Jerry Murphy flew the event on Sunday. Rick won the Columbine Cup, which also gave him the 8-Round win. On Saturday, F1S electric was a real horse race, with all three competitors—Jack Murphy, Jerry Murphy (no relation), and Don DeLoach—clean after four rounds. In the Centennial Cup flyoff, Jack went on to a 120-second max. Don missed the max by just 6 seconds, to take second place, while Jerry was third. The next day, Jack <u>once again</u> maxed all four rounds, to take both the Columbine Cup and the 8-Round championship. Don was second in the 8-Round event, followed by Jerry.

In the <u>AMA/NFFS/SAM events</u>, Saturday's CLG event saw both Mark Covington and Don DeLoach putting up three maxes in the first six flights. Don walked away with the win in the ensuing flyoff. Barbecue Chef Frank Menanno came in third.

Meanwhile, in E-36 electric Jerry Murphy edged out Jack Murphy of Utah for first place. Rick Pangell wasn't far behind, and Don DeLoach rounded out the field.

In AMA Fast Gas Combo, Rick Pangell was the only flyer to put up a flight, so he garnered the win. Don DeLoach and Ray Boyd both flew Old Time Rubber Combo, with Don placing first. Don was also on a winning streak in P-30, where he put up three straight maxes. John McGrath placed second.

On Sunday, it took Jace Pivonka just four HLG flights to make three maxes and take the win. Don DeLoach was just 10 seconds behind, for second place. Mark Covington was third, followed by Frank Menanno.

In A/B Electric Combo, Don DeLoach was nearly perfect, missing a maxout by just 7 seconds. Jack Murphy wasn't far behind, and Rick Pangell placed third. Don also took Classic Towline. Ray Boyd put up the only flight in Mulvihill/Moffett, and it was a max for the Gollywock.

Don continued his winning ways in Nostalgia Rubber Combo, narrowly edging out Ray Boyd. Both were flying trusty Gollywocks. It was great to see Albuquerque's Bob Galler with his Cloud Tramp flying this event. Bob also had some beautiful Old-Timer RC models on display at the contest headquarters tent. Rick Pangell was our sole flyer in Slow Gas Combo. Flying his 1/2A, he put up a nice max.

The **<u>awards ceremony</u>** on Sunday afternoon was short and sweet, culminating in the traditional champagne for the FAI two-day champions to share with everyone present. After that, all hands present set about the tasks of "striking camp" and cleaning up. Soon the only visible signs of the grand event that had taken place were the couple of RVs that would be spending one more beautiful night on the prairie before departing.

In summary, the 2021 14-Rounder Contest was great, by just about any measure: great weather, great flying, great camaraderie—and great food. And what a nice change from last year, when the specter of COVID hung so drearily over everything.


