PONDERINGS DEP'T


April 24th is our first Outdoor Scramble..!!!

PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS

Opening Day at the Field! Someone mentioned to me that the April Scramble has two distinctions. First, it's the one most likely to run into weather troubles, and second, it's the most attended Scramble of the year-and for good reason. Our outdoor planes may have forgotten how to fly, and we've got to beat them back into submission! This coming Sunday (the 24th) is our first Scramble of the season, with our illustrious newsletter Editor in Chief Rick Pangell running the show as CD. Flying begins at 0900. I say that now, but a quick check of the weather as of Monday shows "partly sunny, high near 54. Breezy, with a chance of rain and snow showers." Just another sunny day in Edinburgh, in other words. Seriously, I went through a bunch of copies of Aero Modeller the other day and judging by some of the photos, those UK guys will fly in anything.

Keep an eye on the Group Io board for latest info. Our practice is to avoid rescheduling if possible, so be patient with Rick if final decisions aren't until game time. His call, though. Default is Go.

Now to celebrate a few highlights from the indoor season—which was amazing. I count not fewer than five indoor events where the club hit home runs in student-level contact and active recruitment. We began with our strong presence running the flying events at the Southern Region Science Olympiad contest down in Pueblo. At one point I took a glance at the scoring table and occurred to me that the students had no idea just how abundantly qualified was the crew running the event. If they'd counted all of the national championship winners, advanced academic degree holders, published designers and modelers of national and international renown who were weighing the models and timing their flights, they would have been astounded. I know I was impressed! The quality of flying was ultimately very impressive, and Don's comment on the winning flight was telling: "That was better than any of us could have done." The winning model flew like a witch, dodging every obstacle up near the ceiling. After some heart-stopping near misses, the pair of students from Lewis-Palmer HS ended up with a nice clean 2:23.

By good fortune, there was enough time between the Regional and State Sci Oly tournaments that we were able to schedule a Build/Trim/Fly event for Sci Oly students at Manitou High School. This was quite well attended, with ten students visiting, from as far afield as Gunnison and Cherry Creek. Students built fresh Sci Oly kits—either rubber or capacitor, depending on grade—and every team did a nice job improving their game for the State tournament two weeks later. This event was this year's "Kid's Contest," and feedback was extremely positive.

The State tournament was held at UC Colorado Springs, and flying was in the Gallogly Event center, which is a very nice venue, and would be a great spot to hold future free flight events. If we have to give up the City Aud, Gallogly wouldn't be a bad alternative. In order to get our nose under the tent flap, Sean McEntee has agreed to enroll at UCCS in the Fall ⁽²⁾. He's already planning his approach to whomever holds those keys. This event was notable for the strong showing from up in the Northern District, and ultimately, though our good friend Kate put on an action-packed final flight, she was beaten by a team from up north who had their plane absolutely beautifully trimmed, with exactly the right size rubber to take advantage of the room—on the final flight of the contest, no less.

Responding to a request from the Colorado Springs School, Don DeLoach assembled a team from the club and did a bangup job building 13 P-18's with middle schoolers. That couldn't have been easy, given time constraints, but in the end, every student got to experience indoor free flight in the company of masters. Don and his team did such a great job that the school made a very nice donation to the club. Way to go!

Then came the Ceiling Climb. David Aronstein joined Don running the event, and with plenty of action in the air, the contest was a thrill. We had the Chuck Andraka crew up from New Mexico, and what a professional bunch that is! Eight or nine work tables set up at even intervals down one side of the gym provided work and operating space for the group, and it's clear as the years progress that the students are acquiring higher and higher levels of skill. At one point a few of us watched as a student grabbed a pole to get her plane from high up on a backboard. "Shouldn't we go help?" No need. Ultimately Don won Grand Champ, which has eluded him for vears, and a new national record was set in F1M by **Anjulie Sorbello (S)** 6:15:57+6:15.82 12:31.39, one of Chuck Andrake's recruits..!

And let's not forget John Christensen, who faithfully has been running Beth Eden events in Lakewood all season—and a bunch of them! Not sure what the count is for this season, but it feels like six or eight events. Thank you, John for keeping the flame alive in Denver. To everyone who played a hand in this year's Indoor success—especially with multiple appearances, I offer a huge MMM thank you. Well done, guys!

A five person team from the MMM Free Flight Club conducted both Wright Stuff events at Colorado's Southern Region Science Olympiad tournament in Pueblo. In this category, there are two flying events. High school aged competitors fly a rubber powered plane roughly the size of a P-18, while middle school students fly a capacitor-powered plane of similar size. By happy coincidence, the winners of the Southern Region high school event (pictured above) were two students at Lewis-Palmer High School in Monument, CO where club member John McGrath happens to teach.

During the course of the day, MMM members processed entries and timed flights and made the pitch to students to visit the club's "home court" in Manitou Springs for a Pre-State Sci Oly Tournament Build/Trim/Fly event. That event also was a success, with some students travel-ling upwards of 100 miles to attend. The Club members have been busy with these indoor build and fly sessions in the region throughout the spring.

The MMM Club similarly supported the Science Olympiad State Finals at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, in April.





April 9-10 with Youth Build on the 11th


It was a fun event. The NATs will be held there the 24th thru the 28th of May. It's well worth the trip just to fly there.
